Updates and Information

SB 3007

Last month, Governor Rauner signed SB3007: The Survivor Support and Trafficking Prevention Act. This bill will provide state-funded services (including SNAP, TANF and Medicaid) for foreign-born survivors of trafficking, torture and other crimes! SB3007 not only will provide meaningful supports for precertified survivors of trafficking it will also provide access to these programs to anyone preparing to file or waiting for a decision on a T-Visa, U-Visa or asylum. The law will go into effect on January 1, 2018.

Polaris Project: Get the Facts

Although slavery is commonly thought to be a thing of the past, human traffickers generate hundreds of billions of dollars in profits by trapping millions of people in horrific situations around the world, including here in the U.S. Traffickers use violence, threats, deception, debt bondage, and other manipulative tactics to force people to engage in commercial sex or to provide labor or services against their will. Although more research is needed on the scope of human trafficking, Polaris has compiled the facts and figures. Click here.

The National Johns Suppression Initiative, a nationwide antitrafficking operation targeting sex buyers, is reporting record breaking numbers from its most recent sting. Exposing Sex Trafficking in US Cantinas & Bars

Earlier this month, Polaris released a report exposing brutal exploitation young women and girls from Mexico face in U.S. cantinas and bars. Since 2007, the Polaris operated National Human Trafficking Hotline has identified more than 1,300 women and girls who have been apparent victims of sex trafficking in illicit bars that operate largely beyond the reach of law enforcement. As many as 63% of the victims were minors and some were forced to have sex as much as 50 times a day.

Rotary Projects Address Human Trafficking

Rotary District 5180 is working on a large global grant to create a sustainable large scale project in the Sacramento CA region to combat human trafficking. "Human trafficking is the second biggest issue in the World (only behind drug trafficking) according to the FBI," states the project's executive summary. Working with a diverse group of local agencies and non-profits, the project design includes a broad-based, holistic education program and the establishment of an Assessment Center focused on young girls who have been victims of human trafficking. Future plans include broadening the scope of the Assessment Center. For more information on the project, or for any related questions, please contact **Dr. Brian K. Gladden** or **Bob Deering.**

Rotary District 5110 in partnership with Rotarians in Manila is working on a project to combat sex trafficking in the Philippines. "In January 2016, the Greater Grants Pass Rotary Club conducted the "More Than A Survivor" service project in Southern Oregon, that featured survivors of sex trafficking from the United States for their talents and achievements beyond their story of survival. The photo exhibit was educational - what is trafficking and how do we protect our communities - and a message of hope for what great triumphs are possible from even the most tragic and terrible of experiences." A series of events following the "More Than A Survivor" project have culminated in the development of this global grant, working in partnership with the RC of Manpasan (Manila) and International Justice Mission (IJM was featured at the Seoul Convention). also growing is a hidden epidemic of sexual abuse, rape and human trafficking. "Some locals liken this climate to a "Wild West" - one in which abusers are emboldened and sometimes even protected."

- Seasonal marijuana trimmers, nicknamed
 "trimmigrants," say they were coerced into sexual acts in exchange for pay.
- A teenage trimmer was held in captivity.
- A grower was found guilty of 15 felony counts, including rape and false imprisonment.

Despite evidence of a problem, law enforcement officials have put few resources into investigations of trafficking and sexual exploitation. Instead, they tend to focus on what they view as the root cause of the problem: the drug trade. <u>Click here</u> for the full article.
